

Increase Family-Planning Funding

Title X (“ten”) of the Public Health Service Act is the cornerstone of the nation’s family-planning program. According to the Guttmacher Institute, publicly funded contraceptive services, such as those provided by Title X, help women prevent 1.3 million unintended pregnancies annually.

- Title X provides more than 5 million low-income women and men with basic health care.
- Title X offers voluntary, confidential reproductive-health services, including education, counseling, and, when appropriate, referrals for other medical services.
- Title X also provides basic reproductive-health care such as screening for breast cancer, cervical cancer, and sexually transmitted diseases; Pap tests; breast and pelvic exams; hypertension and blood-pressure measurement; as well as prenatal, postpartum and well-baby care.
- By law, Title X funds cannot be used to pay for abortion care.
- Sen. John McCain has voted to eliminate the Title X program, but Sen. Barack Obama is a steadfast supporter of family planning.
